- 1. Improves student learning by improving teacher practice, shifting the focus from teaching to learning
- 2. Offers a structure for scholarly dialogue where educators engage in work that necessitates trust, respect, and mutual enrichment
- 3. Contributes to a fundamental shift in the habits of mind that teachers bring to their daily work in the classroom
- 4. Contributes to teachers' higher levels of social support for achievement and higher levels of authentic pedagogy
- 5. Encourages sharing, reflecting, and risk-taking to change instructional practices
- 6. Supports stronger linkages between student achievement and teachers' professional learning
- 7. Embraces collaborative inquiry at the heart of the process
- 8. Allows for the analysis of multiple sources of evidence of student learning and response to learning needs with a host of well-researched instructional practices
